Peninsula Township Fire Department Mission Statement

Goals for this budget

- To provide the best possible FIRE & EMS service to the residents.
- Assure the safety of the firefighters & citizens.
- Recruit and retain more firefighters within the community.
- Upgrade the apparatus, equipment and fire stations

Providing the best service

- Hire three firefighter/paramedics to upgraded to ALS service .
- Staff both stations with a minimum of two firefighters.
- Staffing will be 2 fulltime & 2 part-time firefighters.
- Training to the highest standard.
- Public Education & Fire Prevention Programs

Assure the safety of firefighters & citizens

- Assure firefighters are trained to a high level
- Assure equipment is maintained
- Assure firefighter PPE is maintain and cleaned
- Offering home safety inspections for residents
- Offering CPR and First aid courses to residents

Recruitment and retention of Firefighters

- Awareness that the FD needs firefighters
- Creating better communication line with public
- Increased pay for firefighter positions
- Change in the image of the fire department

Upgrade of apparatus, equipment and fire stations.

- Replace apparatus according to 15 year plan
- Replace equipment in timely fashion and continuously look at the latest technology.
- Fire stations need to be replaced and relocated for better service to the community and for the safety and efficiency of the firefighters .

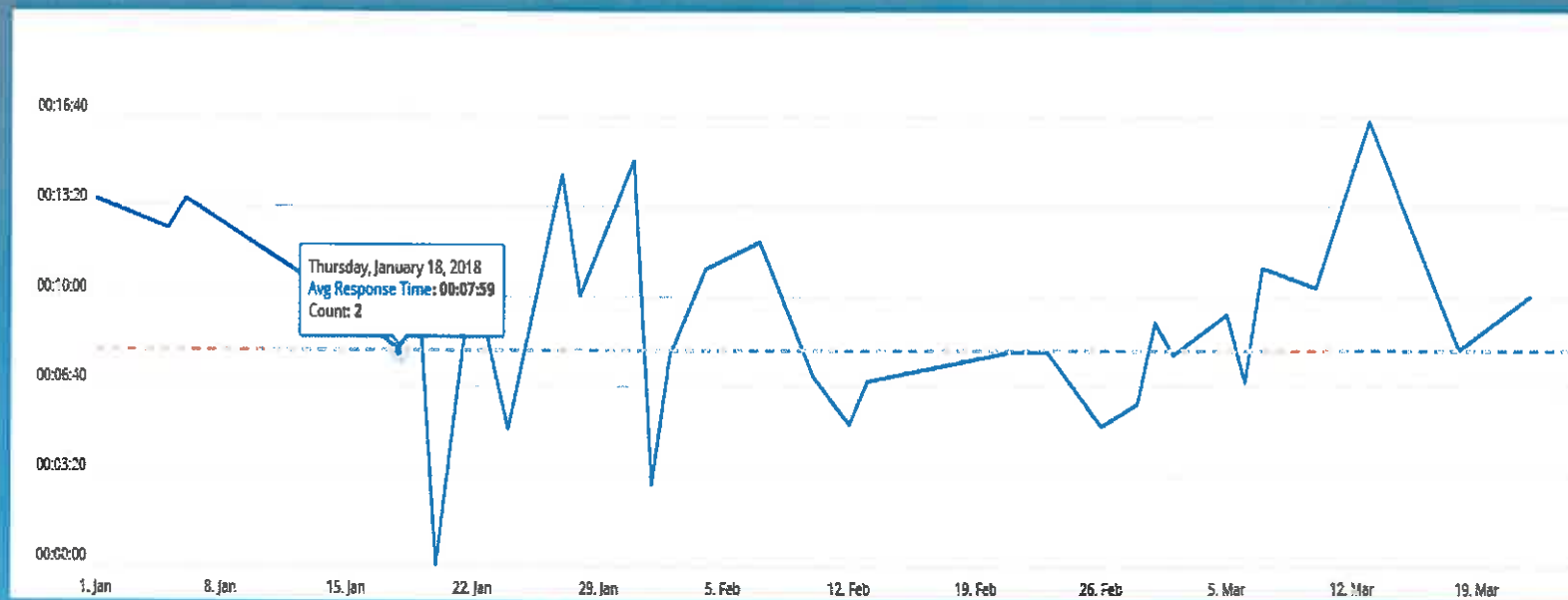
Average turnout times

The fire department currently averages a time of 51 seconds to leave the station for an emergency run. This time puts the fire department in the 90th percentile for turnout times.



Average Response Times

Average response times from Jan. 1, 2018 to March 25, 2018 is 9:01. The national average is eight minutes for fire response and 4 minutes for an agency that provides BLS transport service.



The number one goal of the fire department is to reduce response times! This budget will move us closer to reaching this goal.
