#### FROM THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT...

#### Purchase of Development Rights

In May, the Township Board renewed a contractual agreement with the Grand Traverse Regional Land Conservancy to continue to implement the agricultural preservation / PDR program. Since 1994, thanks to two voter-approved mileages and our partnership with the Land Conservancy, over half of the designated prime agricultural land in Peninsula Township has been permanently protected.

We are excited to introduce Laura Rigan, Farmland Protection Specialist at the Land Conservancy, as the point person for this agreement. Laura was born and raised on the peninsula and will provide a number of services to assist Peninsula Township and the PDR committee. Some of Laura's duties will be to develop and maintain working relationships with PDR applicants (including applicants from Application Round IV), to visit properties and prepare easement and closing documents, to track eligible funding and grant opportunities, and to showcase the township's farmland preservation efforts to increase private investments in the program. The Conservancy has already secured significant matching funds, and is committed to monitoring future grant opportunities to further our land protection efforts.

Also in PDR news, the Township Board will be reviewing new applicants for the PDR selection committee. The purpose of the selection committee is to advise the Township Board in the selection of eligible lands for purchase.

## **Donation of Development Rights**

Peninsula Township also offers a Donation of Development Rights (DDR) program. DDR allows landowners to permanently protect important agricultural, natural, and open spaces through a tax-deductible conservation easement donation.

#### **Events Ordinance**

The Board of Trustees would like you to know that we have heard your concerns about some recent large events held on the peninsula (i.e. road races). We will be reviewing the events ordinance in the near future.

#### Updating the Newsletter's Mailing List

In the first quarter, 2017 Newsletter from the Township, residents were asked if they preferred snail mail, email, or some other correspondence media. Nearly 350 households clipped the small survey form that was in the Newsletter and returned it to the Town Hall. While the majority of respondents indicated their preference for a mailed Newsletter, over a hundred individuals said they would prefer receiving the Newsletter via email. The Clerk's office has been slowly going through the returned mail to update the mailing addresses of our residents so that by the end of the year, each household will receive the Newsletter via the communication link that it prefers.

#### **New PDR Selection Committee**

Five residents have applied to be on the new 2017 PDR selection committee, within the timeframe set by the Town Board. They include: Virginia Coulter, Harold David Edmondson, Karen Cline, Susan Tarczon, and Mary Manner.

#### FROM THE ASSESSOR...

Several special assessment districts were approved this spring covering a variety of projects (road improvements, drainage districts and city water extension). Work is currently under way and the expectation is for all district projects to be completed by November 2017. Residents in the impacted areas will receive special assessment bills annually (separate from property tax bills) beginning summer 2017.

#### FROM THE TREASURER'S OFFICE...

#### Summer Taxes Are Due...

July 1st is when we will begin to collect Summer tax payments. As a kind reminder Summer tax payments are due by September 14th, 2017. Please make checks payable to <u>Peninsula Township</u>. For your convenience, you may pay by mail or in person at our Township Office. We also have a secured drop box out front of the Township entrance doors. This allows you to drop your payment in the box when the office is closed. Another alternative is our pay on line option. You will find it on the Peninsula Township home page. Just click on it and follow the step by step instructions.

Many of our residents pay their taxes via their mortgage/escrow companies. We wanted to let you know to look on your tax bill for a statement, "This Bill Has Been Sent To Your Escrow Company". If you have this specific statement on your bill it means it will be paid by those sources and eliminates your writing a check as well. If this statement is not on your bill then your taxes will need to be paid by you.

#### Special Assessment Districts...

There are a number of Specials Assessment District-residents who will receive a separate bill. Please note it will be in a different colored envelope than your tax bill and will have "Special Assessment Bill" on the front of it. Please keep an eye open for it as this will be the first installment for many of those residents in the new and recently created Special Assessment Districts (SAD). SAD payments are due in our office from July 1st to September 14th, 2017. Checks are to be made payable to *Peninsula Township*. Please note that beginning on September 15th, a 1% per month interest penalty will be incurred. Further, if the payment is not received by November 1st, it is added to the Winter Tax bill for collection.

#### FROM THE SHERIFF...

The Township recently purchased two new *All Traffic Solutions* radar devices to add to the one the Township already owns. These devices are portable and can be moved to areas of traffic concern. They can be programmed to flash a motorist's speed when passing a sign as well as record the number of vehicles and their speeds when passing through an area. Don't worry, they do not take a photograph, and you won't end up on social media!

In the first five days, Friday, June 16th to Tuesday, June 20th, one of the devices was set on Center Road near Timber Lane. During that time, there were over 20,000 vehicles traveling North on to the Peninsula. The average speed of those vehicles ranged from 46 to 49 mph. In a 24-hour period, there was an average of 167 vehicles per hour traveling north during the five-day period. Of the 167 vehicles, an average of 72 vehicles were traveling at or below the speed limit; 89 vehicles were traveling the speed limit or five mph over the speed limit; and 5 vehicles were traveling 10 mph or more over the

speed limit. The average speed of motorists over this time period was 46.3 mph. 66.1% of motorists adjusted the speed they were traveling as a result of the device. These are just some basic statistics that can be gathered. This data will allow the Township to stay on top of traffic safety issues while working with the Sheriff's Department, MDOT and the Grand Traverse County Road Commission.

Peninsula Township has lost 600 trees to the County Road Commission's "Road Improvement" projects within the last 2 years! Several beautiful, wooded roads on the Peninsula are likely to be worked on within the next two years. Please read and sign the SAVE OUR TREES petition that would require the Road Commission to adopt MDOT's less aggressive tree removal guidelines and give residents 60 days-notice of intended removals. # ARCHITECTURE OF THE OLD MISSION PENINSULA

A HISTORY OF VERNACULAR HOUSING STYLES.

This hand-rendered sketch of the J.M. Smith house was done by Greg Alban, a MSU student in the Landscape Architecture Program at Michigan State University. It shows the home as it looked in 1988 when it was photographed by J. Westphal. It housed one of the earliest residents on the Old Mission Peninsula. The 2017 photo illustrates how a residental structure changes over its lifetime by small, incremental modifications. A house such as this, provides an important link to the cultural heritage of the Peninsula. --Dr. J.M. Westphal



**Housing Genre**: National Folk Style with a Pyramid Roof, 18249 Mission Road. **History**: This was Reverend J.M. Smith's home in the Old Mission townsite. Built in 1866, it is one of the few pyramidal roofed, national folk houses on the Peninsula. Balloon architecture and asymmetrical window and door treatment of the front facade were a tell-tale characteristic of national folk homes.
