A. Welcome new committee member! (All) Christine Murphy was introduced and welcomed as the newest member of the parks committee.

B. Rank Capital Investment Projects (Murphy)

The committee used the 2022 LIAA study (available peninsulatownship.com/documents/parks/Peninsula Township Feasibility Study and Parks Capital Projects) for project lists and initial costs. The LIAA report summarizes the acreage of the parks and has maps and surveys.

The bathrooms at Bowers Harbor scored the highest priority from the citizen survey. A suggestion for use of portable restroom trailers at Bowers Harbor Parks for the summer to be investigated. An overall design for just the parking area might be considered as a separate item and a more doable project. Gourdie-Fraser and Beckett & Raeder have not responded yet for a parking design plan and estimates.

Chown: The town board is holding a strategic planning session February 25, 2025, to go over the Maner Costerian study recommendations in "Organizational Analysis and Recommendations for Township Government Structure Report "dated November 19, 2024. The parks committee needs to be organized to put forward the capital investment improvement projects the parks need over the next 10 years. There are the needs and wishes. The township board must figure this out. Is it Headlee, a millage, or a charter

township? The township survey going out this spring can give us an idea of how much the citizens of the township are willing to tax themselves for park capital investment improvements.

Zebell: Sanders explained to me is the capital investment projects-in-process monies will not be part of our budget and categorized as Capital Investment Project Fund (CIP). The funds for the Hemlock wing boardwalk, Kelley boat launch, signage, and Pelizzari expansions are considered earmark appropriations and are not included in the budget. After the meeting, Zebell emailed the updated capital improvement information, and this is included here and at the end of these minutes.

Jane Boursaw 12875 Bluff Road: the Murray trail head is part of Old Mission State Park. Old Mission State Park is owned by the State of Michigan and the township has a long terms lease on the 650 acres. The 5 acres around the lighthouse are owned by the township and known as Mission Point Lighthouse Park.

- C. Spending requests for 2024/25 Fiscal Year (Zebell) The budget from the previous year was assessed. The budget money left over from 2024/20225 will be spent on 2 dog way stations, split rail fencing at Ridgewood and Murray trail heads, and potential seed purchases for Pelizzari Natural Area.
- D. Finalize 2025/26 Parks Budget (Zebell)
 - The budget document was discussed. The park revenue was reviewed (see page 12 in the meeting packet). The committee can use supplies, park signs, seedling and planting services, and community activities dollar amounts in the budget for discretionary items. The other budget items are already encumbered. Zebell recorded the numbers and will send to all members. The final budget approval to come at the March 31, 2025, meeting.
