Mr. Rick Hager gave an outstanding presentation and submitted a proposal regarding native meadow plantings at PNA. There's enthusiastic support for the proposal and finding funding. Mr. Hager would be donating his time and expertise; the cost of \$4,000 per acre is primarily herbicide and seeds.

Park care

Committee members are identifying trees that need pruning. Wooly adelgid is a worry; looking into injection cost seems prudent for future planning.

Signage







The Propes

- Select three one-acre plots in strategic locations at PNA
- Prepare sites for planting by mowing 3 times. (~April, July, September)
- Install signage to inform and educate the public about the process of restoration (April)
- Allow for green up and herbicide spray plots (Rodeo, Milestone) to kill non-native species (October)
- Broadcast native forb and grass seed with a cover crop (~January)
- Mow plots three times first year (~April, July, September), twice second year (~April, July) and once (~April) third year
- Volunteers to hand weed plots as needed. Spot spray herbicide as needed.



Benefits

- Replace non-native invasive weeds with a diverse and sustainable planting of native grasses and colorful forbs to improve viewscape and enhance visitor experience
- Increase biodiversity, improve wildlife habitat, provide food and refuge for imperiled pollinator species
- Potential source of native plant seeds that could be used to expand PNA plantings or start new plantings elsewhere at a reduced cost


